The Fall Semester is in the air, hurricane season is in full swing, and Rush is now over, so a few updates about our chapter and some of the things we are excited about.

First, my name is Marshall Richards, **OK** 847, and I am the Eminent Commander – proud to be the 47th Commander of Theta Kappa. I am a Senior in Finance, from Canton GA, and attended Creekview High School before Georgia Southern. I am privileged to have a great officer team and chapter to lead. As of today, our chapter has 93 active brothers and we finished Spring Semester at 122 earning us an Over 100 Manpower Award, which is a first for Theta Kappa, a Sigma Nu Rock Chapter!

We completed our Fall Semester recruitment just a few weeks ago, and we had 42 men accept the Sigma Nu bids with 10 of those being legacies. Our bid acceptance rate was over 91%. Our goal was 42-45 total guys to accept their bids, which would put us at over 130 members for the fall, so we attained this!

This fall we begin the celebration of the 50th anniversary of Theta Kappa, a major milestone which we will be celebrating through 2020. Here are the major events we will celebrate for the next several years! We are all excited about these significant achievements each year:

- 2017: 50 years: Founding on 11/17/1967
- 2018: 50 years: Colonization on 5/6/1968
- 2018: 1000 initiates in Theta Kappa
- 2019: 150 years as Sigma Nu on 1/1/1869
- 2020: 50 years: Chartering on 5/10/1970

A lot of remarkable things have happened since 1967 – to be fair, we have had good times and tough times. Today, however, we are on an all-time high thanks to a combined effort of the collegiate chapter, our advisement team, the house corporation, our alumni, and the Sigma Nu HQs staff in Lexington. Hence, we want each of you to come and enjoy a weekend (or more) at "Southern", reminisce about the old times, and help us recommit to the next 50!

We just recently had some more good news as Adam Clay, **OK 810**, our 45th Commander was recognized as an Alpha Affiliate; he will be **inducted at this summer's 68th** Grand Chapter in Washington DC. This is a very noteworthy achievement to a well-deserved brother and we congratulate him on his selection, which is a first for Theta Kappa.

Our next Grand Chapter is just around the corner, so the entire chapter is determined to receive our 2nd Rock Chapter award. After a great beginning with our first AAB advisory meeting, our executive board is ready to strive for more in this **year's** Pursuit of Excellence, in hopes to receive another Rock Chapter.

The Theta Kappa Chapter (GS) is a Sigma Nu Rock Chapter, which is an honor reserved for those chapters who attain only the highest ratings in the Sigma Nu Pursuit of Excellence program. In 2016, only 11 chapters in Sigma Nu were recognized as Rock Chapters with six (6) of those being in the Southeast, including 3 chapters from Georgia, which were UGA, Georgia Tech, and Georgia Southern.


